TRANSFIGURATION

Matthew 16:37-17, 21-23, 17:1-9

Conclusion

The first person that we note in the Transfiguration is the man, Jesus Christ. The second notation is that of three simple human beings. These three men were not extraordinary men. They were ordinary Jews with an extraordinary calling. These were called of God to be apostles of Jesus Christ.

Jesus separated these men from the other disciples that they may accompany Him to the place of prayer. Jesus was accustomed to spending time in prayer both in the morning and evening. The disciples seemingly did not place prayer in such high priority as did Jesus Christ. There were three cases in which the Savior separated these men to be with Him. In each case, death was involved. In these cases, Jesus revealed His three-fold attitude toward death. In the house of Jairus, the Lord was **Master** over death when He raised Jairus' daughter from death. He spoke words of living love when He said, "Damsel (young girl), I say unto thee, arise." On the Mt. of Transfiguration, Jesus Christ was **superior** over death. He passed into the glory of the eternal without the touch of death. He revealed the glory of the resurrection before their very eyes. Later on Jesus revealed another attitude toward death. In the Garden of Gethsemane He **yielded** unto death. Christ yielded unto death as if He knew it was the will of the Father. Because of the sin of Adam and Eve, death was brought upon all mankind, and our Savior had to die to save us from sin and the second death.

Why were these three disciples chosen with Christ in these three cases? Might it have been because of their attitudes toward death? When Christ first spoke of His death, Peter (I use this phrase cautiously) "came unglued." "Be it far from Thee, Lord." This may be an indication that inwardly Peter was **afraid of death**. With James and John the opposite may have been true. When their mother asked for the best seats in the kingdom for her boys, the other disciples became rather indignant. But Jesus asked a question that may have relieved the anger of the others. The question, "Are ye able to drink of the cup that I shall drink of?" They answered, "We are able!" Putting this a little more into our language and slang. "Oh yeah, Lord, we can handle that. We can do that with one hand tied behind us." They were **overly courageous** about death.

The disciples were probably about half asleep, when suddenly they were awakened by a most glorious sight. Jesus, Who had told them of His death, was now surrounded with the glory and power of heaven. The disciples came

to realize that Jesus was more than a mortal man. Christ was talking with two men from heaven, whom the disciples recognized. Suddenly, while being only partially awake, Peter spoke and said in his excitement, "Let us make three tabernacles, one for Thee, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." Tabernacles are dwellings for immediate use. What did Elijah and Moses need with earthly dwellings? Jesus Christ would soon be going back to heaven. According to the Bible, Peter did not know what to say. Did you ever "stick your foot in your mouth?" as the saying is used! Peter's speech was a blunder: speaking without thinking. There is an old saying that goes something like this - "Before thy tongue is accelerated, be sure thy brain is engaged." That may be a good recommendation. Consider this: Peter may have been like many believers today. They prefer to dwell on the mountaintop of religious emotional experience than to go down into the valley where there is hunger and need, and lost people. Each believer is needed in the valley where there are sinners and helpless ones.

The third scene is about two great men in the history of Israel. These men were involved in the Judaic Law and economy that Christ was about to fulfill. Moses and Elijah had important roles in the Law of God handed down to Israel through Moses. Their presence in heaven was due to their faith in the promises of God. Moses was the heroic law-giver and deliverer of Israel. Elijah was the lion-hearted prophet that "stood-up" to kings. Moses was the founder of the economy. Elijah was the reformer and revivalist. These two men were conversing with the Savior concerning His "exodus" from earth and His ministry among men. Christ's death and departure from earth was more than just the end of His human life. It included preaching to the Old Testament spirits in prison, taking the keys of hell and death from Satan, setting free the saints and righteous, and bringing them to glory. His exodus included the resurrection, ascension, and being inaugurated at the right hand of the Father. Jesus Christ was about to fulfill the Mosaic Law. This law was divided and executed in three areas: civil, ceremonial, and moral. The civil laws pertained to the laws of the nation of Israel. The ceremonial laws related to the various sacrifices, washings, procedures in the Temple, and in personal sacrifices. The moral code related to the ten commandments and the principles of them. Jesus fulfilled the civil and ceremonial divisions of the economy. But the ten commandments were brought over into Christianity, and

the principles of the moral code were expanded. The significance of the presence of Moses and Elijah related to the fulfillment of the Law in which they had had such a great part.

The fourth scene is the voice from heaven. Just prior to this, Peter had answered both good and bad in response to what Christ had said. Peter responded with a blunder, but the voice from heaven squelched the blundering speech. Oh that today the voice from heaven might speak to suppress, and end, the blundering speech of cults, unbelievers, pagans, and the antichrist. This voice brings together everyone in Jesus Christ, if heard, because it repels all personal doctrine and perverted beliefs in "hear ye Him." When people hear the voice of Christ and His teachings, and obey "to the letter", all personal views matter not. Peter had listened to himself, to the Father, and even to Satan, now the Father is saying, hear My Son.

From the point of a great wonderful experience, the disciples move with Jesus as He makes a course to the cross. He had a few stops along the way: the triumphal entry, cleansing of the temple, and Gethsemane, to name a few. One great stop was the Garden where He surrendered totally to the will of the Father.

In a further analysis of the announcement Christ made of His death, we may conclude that Peter was suggesting the glory of Christ without the cross, even though he was not aware of the implications. There are people in the church that deny and reject the cross where Christ's blood was shed. There was an associate pastor of a large eastern church that said, "Since when does orthodoxy, church membership, or anything else require that we believe in the virgin birth, bodily resurrection, the - of all things - substi-

tutionary atonement of Jesus Christ?' Since when? since Jesus Christ died on the cross and shed His blood there. We must believe that He is who He said, and believe what He did for salvation, and what is required to receive salvation from sin. The watered down, modernistic gospel of this age, is leaving people like the Athenians - before an altar to an unknown god.

The Transfiguration was for the disciples of Christ to endure what was set before them in a short time. But it is also that we may know the crucifixion and death of Christ was for us, also. The Transfiguration should also remind us that Jesus Christ is coming again. Are you ready? "Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb?" Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you can be saved. Confess to Christ your lost condition, if you are unsaved, and He will gladly save you now.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR BELIZE PRIMARY AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

The Nationals of Belize have formulated and instituted an effective scholarship program to aid worthy students from Methodist Protestant schools on the primary and high school level. These grants will be considered on an annual basis. The Board of Missions approved this program in 2007. Your WMS Auxiliary, Zone, Branch or Church are urged to participate in helping these students who are active in Methodist Protestant Churches, San Lazaro or Sand Hill Zion. Alabama's Branch report, by President, Rev. Martha Headley, to the recent 2008 Convention stated that grants were provided for two high school students from each of our schools (total was \$1,050). A total of \$1,283.00 was raised to sponsor primary students (8 children sponsored last year and 17 children sponsored this year.) These funds came from a variety of sources: VBS offerings, Sunday School, Penny March Money, individuals, and WMS Auxiliaries.

Belize Methodist Protestant Annual High School Scholarship/Grant Program

This annual grant is equal to the value of one year's tuition to the high school of the recipient's choice and the purchase of the necessary textbooks. The recipient of this scholarship/grant will be chosen by the Manager and Principal of the local MP primary school, along with the pastor of the local MP church using the following criteria:

He/She must be the person in the Standard VI class of the local MP primary school who received the highest score on the P.S.E. (Primary School Examination) and has regularly attended the local MP church.

Before receiving the scholarship/grant, the recipient and his/her guardian(s) must accept and pledge to comply with the following regulations by signing the form provided.

This scholarship/grant will be for a period of one year only.

The recipient of the grant will be required to attend the

weekly services at the local MP church, as well as attend their youth meetings.

This grant will cover the purchase of books and tuition for the first year only.

All money for the grant will be paid directly to the high school, and the receipts for tuition and books purchased will be the property of the local MP primary school. No money will be given directly to the recipient and/or his/her guardian(s).

The books bought will be the property of the local MP primary school, and as such must be handed into the management of the school at the end of the school year.

In the event that the recipient successfully advances to the next class, consideration will be given to allow that person to trade the books into the high school they are attending to obtain a discount on the purchase of future books.

Written authority for the recipient or his/her guardian(s) to do this must be obtained in advance from the Manager and Principal of the local MP primary school. Failure to obtain the proper authority may result in the recipient and/or his/her guardian(s) being required to provide reimbursement equal to the value of the books.

Belize Methodist Protestant Annual Primary School Child Sponsorship Program

He/she must be registered as a student of either Pancotto Primary School in Sand Hill Village or San Lazaro Methodist Protestant School in San Lazaro Village. Financial status, behavior, religious affiliation, as well as the prior educational performance of the student will be taken into account in deciding who the final recipients of the sponsorships will be.

Recipients receiving this sponsorship will be chosen by the Manager and Principal of the local MP primary school, along with the pastor of the local MP church using the fol-

lowing additional guidelines:

Before being awarded sponsorship, the student’s guardian(s) must accept and pledge to comply with the following regulations by signing at the bottom of this form.

This sponsorship will be for a period of one year only.

The student being sponsored will be required to participate in all annual school activities and must attend the weekly services at the local MP church.

The guardian(s) of the student being sponsored will be expected to be available to actively participate in the activities of the school, as well as show a general interest in working along with the school to develop the student and the school. The guardian(s) will be required to schedule monthly visits to the school to meet with the student’s class teacher, as well as the Principal to check on the general progress of the student.

All money for the sponsorship will be paid directly to the school, and the receipts for school fees and books purchased will be the property of the local MP school. No money will be awarded directly to the student and/or his/her guardian(s).

This sponsorship will cover school fees and the purchase of books for one year only.

The books bought will be the property of the local MP school, and as such must be handed in to the principal and/or management of the school at the end of the school year before the student receives his final report card. If the books received at the end of the school year are received in such a condition that they have endured undue wear and tear, the student and/or his guardian(s) may be required to compensate the local MP school for the cost of replacing such books. (In the event that this becomes necessary, normal wear and tear will be taken into consideration when assessing the final value of the books.)

If a student is awarded sponsorship for a specific school year, this will not automatically guarantee that the student will continue to be sponsored for the remaining years he/she is enrolled at the school. Students who have received annual sponsorship may be considered again for sponsorship. However, they will be re-evaluated annually taking into consideration adherence to the above criteria.
